

# Why are things Changing?

Our BC Curriculum has been redesigned to reflect how, and what, students should learn in the 21<sup>st</sup> century.

We are designing a way to communicate student learning that is focused on a meaningful, strength-based and student-inclusive process.

We know that student success increases when families have a clear understanding of their child's learning and students are at the centre of the communications process.

We want students to consider their learning and be able to answer:

Where am I now? Where am I going? How do I get there?

#### What is the Family's Role?

You play a key part in your child's learning and your active participation and engagement during the conference is appreciated.

Please sign-up online for a conference timeslot within the 2-3 week window. There will be a variety of conference times available to choose from including: before school, during school, after school, and in the evening.

Take time to consider your thoughts around the Family Reflection Sheet. This will be sent home in the days prior to your conference.

During the conference, you will have the opportunity to listen to your child, ask questions, and collaborate on setting new learning goals.

## STUDENT INCLUSIVE CONFERENCES IN LANGLEY SCHOOLS

#### Student-Inclusive Conference (Student, Family, Teacher)

- Families will meet with their child and the teacher to discuss student learning.
- Conferences will vary in style, but all will share key components:
  - Duration of about 15-20 minutes;
  - Students will share Evidence of Learning (items that reflect progress);
  - Families will reflect on the growth they have noticed in their child's learning;
  - Teachers will reflect on the student's strengths and next steps;
  - Collaboratively, everyone will set the student's next learning goals;
  - The learning, growth, strengths and next steps discussed in the conference will lead to the development of the Communicating Student Learning Progress Report.

# Communicating Student Learning (CSL) Progress Report

- Replaces the former 'report card'.
- Is a working document completed collaboratively during the conference.
- The CSL Progress Report may not include every subject area, but all learning will be discussed at the conference.
- After the conference, the CSL Progress Report will be shared online through the Parent Portal of MyEDBC.
- The CSL Progress Report uses a Proficiency Scale which replaces traditional letter grades.

## Kindergarten Registration Info



#### Monday, January 15, 2024

All children who will be five years old by December 31, 2024 (children born in 2019) are eligible for the Kindergarten program beginning September 3, 2024. Registration opens Monday, January 15, 2024 and will be open until Friday, March 1, 2024. All Kindergarten registration for the 2024-2025 school year takes place online.

For more information and instructions, please use the QR code above to visit the District website. The following documents are required at the time of registration:

**Proof of Age** One of: Birth Certificate, Certificate of Citizenship, Secure Certificate of Indian Status, Court Order, Canada Immigration Documents, Passport, Permanent Resident Card, other government-issued document

Proof of Citizenship Status One of: Birth Certificate, Certificate of Citizenship, Secure Certificate of Indian Status, Court Order, Canada Immigration Documents, Passport, Permanent Resident Card or Confirmation of Permanent Residency, Nexus card with citizenship listed as Canadian

Proof of Residence One of: Subject-Free Home Purchase Contract, Mortgage Statement, Municipal Tax Bill, Rental Agreement or letter from landlord

One of: British Columbia Driver's License, British Columbia Services Card, British Columbia Vehicle Registration, BCID, Canadian Bank Account or Credit Card Statement, Insurance Statements or Policies, Income Tax Statement, Utility Bill, Employment Pay Slip, other legal or government-issued documents indicating B.C. residence

**Proof of Guardianship** One of: Birth Certificate with parent name, Income Tax Statement – children are declared, Immigration Documents, Court Order, Child in Care documentation
